Candidates for a Bachelor of Science degree are required to complete a minimum of 122 semester hours maintaining a 2.0 overall cumulative grade point average and a 2.0 overall in their Criminal Justice courses. Students must receive a "C" or better in all courses marked with a \*. Transfer students must complete a minimum of thirty (30) credit hours at Husson University. At least fifteen (15) credits must be earned in Husson Criminal Justice courses.
