## Free Electives

Liberal Studies and Education are currently the only majors at Southern Maine Community College that offer free electives. Nine credits of free electives are required to earn an Associate of Arts in Liberal Studies. Three credits of free electives are required to earn an Associate in Science in Education. Free electives are any college level coursework taken across any department at the 100-level or higher (please note: developmental classes do not count as free electives or meet any other graduation requirement).

*\*Although NUTR110 meets Southern Maine Community College's lab science requirement, it may not transfer as a lab science to another college/university. Please note: General education/core course requirements must be met with 100 level courses or higher. Developmental coursework does not count toward meeting these requirements.*
