**Transfer Articulation Agreement for Baccalaureate Degree**  
between

**Southern Maine Community College**

and

**University of Maine Augusta**

**Statement of Purpose**

Southern Maine Community College (SMCC) and the University of Maine Augusta (UMA) have entered into this transfer articulation agreement. The purpose of this agreement is to facilitate student academic transfer and provide a smooth transition from a two-year community college to a university. It is recognized that this agreement shall describe the required program of study at SMCC for admission eligibility to UMA and the Baccalaureate Degree Program indicated.

**Terms and Conditions of Academic Credit Transfer**

**To:** **Bachelor of Science in Mental Health and Human Services – Adult Mental Health Rehabilitation**  
(Name of UMA Academic Program/Degree)

**From:** **Associate in Applied Science in Human Services**  
(Name of SMCC Academic Program/Degree)

The evaluation and transfer of earned college credits shall be in compliance with state and federal education policies and institutional and academic program accreditation standards pertaining to undergraduate academic transfer. Current students and graduates who have earned degrees from Southern Maine Community College shall be eligible for credit evaluation under the terms of this agreement.

Transfer students will be accorded the same standards and criteria for admission to a major degree sequence as UMA students. All applicants accepted to UMA's Baccalaureate programs must fulfill the graduation requirements of the granting institution as identified in Appendices A, B, & C.
