Transfer Articulation Agreement for Baccalaureate Degree
between
Southern Maine Community College
and
University of New England

Statement of Purpose

Southern Maine Community College (SMCC) and the University of New England (UNE) have entered into this transfer articulation agreement. The purpose of this agreement is to facilitate student academic transfer and provide a smooth transition from a two-year community college to a university. It is recognized that this agreement shall describe the required program of study at SMCC for admission eligibility to UNE and the Baccalaureate Degree Program indicated.

Terms and Conditions of Academic Credit Transfer

To: **Bachelor of Arts in Liberal Studies**
(Name of UNE Academic Program/Degree)

From: **Associate in Arts in Liberal Studies**
(Name of SMCC Academic Program/Degree)

The evaluation and transfer of earned college credits shall be in compliance with state and federal education policies and institutional and academic program accreditation standards pertaining to undergraduate academic transfer. Current students and graduates who have earned degrees from Southern Maine Community College shall be eligible for credit evaluation under the terms of this agreement.

Transfer students will be accorded the same standards and criteria for admission to a major degree sequence as UNE students. All applicants accepted to UNE's Baccalaureate programs must fulfill the graduation requirements of the granting institution as identified in Appendix A & B.

Articulation Implementation and Agreement Review

The Chief Academic Officer designee of *the collaborating institutions* shall be responsible for implementing this agreement, for identifying and incorporating any changes into subsequent agreements, and for conducting a *periodic review of this agreement*.

APPENDIX A

This agreement includes specific requirements for admission into a program, outlines requirements, and indicates which degree or diploma can be used to meet program prerequisites as well as general education, major or program, and graduation requirements.

Admissions requirements:

Successful completion of the Associate in Science in Liberal Studies; Achievement of a "C" or better in mathematics and science courses. A completed application, \$40.00 application fee, all official College/University transcripts, official high school transcript with SAT/ACT scores (if applicant has less than 24 college credits). Essays and recommendations are recommended, but not required.

B: Recommended to take prior to transfer to UNE in order to meet UNE general education core requirements.

C: The World History sequence fulfills the UNE general education Human Traditions I & II requirement (6 credits). Recommended for SMCC students to take prior to enrolling at UNE

D: In years three and four, Liberal Studies students concentrate their courses on a theme, issue, culture or time period, developed in close consultation with a Liberal Studies advisor.

E: This includes courses in art history, English, history, philosophy, religion, music theory, literature and languages. (Does *not* include studio art)

F: General Elective credits may be applied to a Minor.

G: Students have the option of taking a semester abroad. Consult with advisor.
