Statement of Purpose

Southern Maine Community College (SMCC) and the University of Southern Maine (USM) have entered into this transfer articulation agreement. The purpose of this agreement is to facilitate student academic transfer and provide a smooth transition from a two-year community college to a university. It is recognized that this agreement shall describe the required program of study at SMCC for admission eligibility to USM and the Baccalaureate Degree Program indicated.

Terms and Conditions of Academic Credit Transfer

To: Bachelor of Arts in History
(Name of USM Academic Program/Degree)

From: Associate in Arts in Liberal Studies with a Focus in History
(Name of SMCC Academic Program/Degree)

The evaluation and transfer of earned college credits shall be in compliance with state and federal education policies and institutional and academic program accreditation standards pertaining to undergraduate academic transfer. Current students and graduates who have earned degrees from Southern Maine Community College shall be eligible for credit evaluation under the terms of this agreement.

Transfer students will be accorded the same standards and criteria for admission to a major degree sequence as USM students. All applicants accepted to USM's Baccalaureate programs must fulfill the graduation requirements of the granting institution as identified in Appendices A, B, and C.

APPENDIX B

Effective spring 2015, general education transfer for students with a completed Associate of Arts in Liberal Studies Degree: With the exception of the capstone, and any other particular USM Core courses required by the student's major, USM Core requirements are waived for students with a **completed** Associate of Arts in Liberal Studies degree from a regionally accredited community or other college. This policy does not apply to any other associate degrees. This policy is effective beginning spring 2015 and is not retroactive. **Student records are automatically reviewed for eligibility.**

APPENDIX C Remaining USM Degree Requirements

Bachelor of Arts in History

The Bachelor of Arts in History degree at USM is 120 credits; History is a 39 credit major + the language requirement. For a full list of major requirements, see: <https://usm.maine.edu/history/ba-history>

Language Requirement for the BA in History at USM:

This requirement can be fulfilled by achieving a grade of at least C in the final semester of a beginning level language course or by examination.

Completion of one of the following courses at USM with a grade of at least C fulfills the language requirement:

American Sign Language: ASL 102, Chinese: CHI 102, French: FRE 102, German: GER 102, Italian: ITA 102, Spanish: SPA 102

History students are encouraged to pursue language study beyond the first year, and to take advantage of USM's Study Abroad programs. Graduate programs in History frequently require intermediate level language proficiency. Students intending to pursue graduate study should take additional language courses.

NOTE: A history major or minor must achieve at least six credits of B or better grades in history courses. No grade of D will count toward fulfillment of a history major or minor.
